Your 2016–2017 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. Child support <u>received</u> for any of your children. Do not include foster care or adoption payments.

Veterans non-education benefits such as Disability, Death Pension, or Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC), and/or VA Educational Work-Study allowances. Do not include federal educational benefits such as: Post 9/11 GI Bill, Montgomery GI Bill, Dependents Education Assistance Program, VEAP Benefits.		
Other untaxed income not reported on this form. Money received, or paid on your behalf (e.g., payment of your bills) by someone other than you and your parents (e.g., grandparents, aunts, uncles, friends), not reported elsewhere on this form for housing, food, utilities, transportation (e.g., car payments, insurance, etc.), and personal expenses.
