The End of the Year is Upon Us!

Wow, how time flies! The Winter Semester will come to a close this week. Thank you again to all of our wonderful students who have made this year fantastic!

Some things to keep in mind as the semester closes:

1. Residence Hall Students: Move out is *this weekend!* If you have applied to live in the Residence Hall this Summer, you must move out of your room and into your Summer room in the West Wing. If you are graduating this Spring you may remain in the Residence hall until May 11, but you must move into the West Wing by May 1. The East Wing will close for renovations beginning May 1.
2. If you are leaving or travelling for the Summer remember that you must get your I-20 signed by either

Grace Philson or Amy Dickerson before you leave the country. (Room 1207 & 1209)

3. If you need your I-20 signed, you must be registered for either in-class Summer classes or full-time Fall classes before your I-20 can be signed.
4. If you are having trouble registering online because of your IH hold, please go to the Registrar window to register, or email your desired class schedule with course codes, section numbers, and your student ID# to: registrar@madonna.edu Registration is now open for Summer 2015, Fall and Winter 2016.
5. Before traveling, check to make sure your passport and visa will still be valid upon your return. If not, you must renew before returning. While passports can be renewed at your

country's embassy or consulate, visas must be applied for in your home country.

6. If your I-20 is going to expire and you need an extension, you must request the extension at the ISO office before the program end date.
7. If you are graduating this semester, **congratulations!** Graduating F-1 students have a 60-day grace period after their end date in which they can remain in the U.S. and/or apply for OPT.
8. Please do not wait until the last day to take care of any documents or registration. We may not be available when you need us!
9. The ISO office will be open as usual throughout the Summer.
