
THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR IS HERE!

CULLTURE CORNER Happy Chuseok!

Last weekend South Korea celebrated one of its largest holidays: Chuseok. Like Thanksgiving in the U.S., Chuseok is a harvest holiday and a time for giving thanks. Specifically, Korean honor their ancestors with food and rituals. Read below to find out more!



Chuseok, known as Korean's Thanksgiving day is celebrated on the 15^{th} day of the 8^{th} month of the lunar calendar. Chuseok lasts for three days which

makes it possible for all of the family members to meet and celebrate the holiday all together.

We visit our ancestral hometowns and prepare a feast and begin our ancestral worship rituals. We visit the graves of our grandparents or parents, and trim the plants or clean the surrounding area of the grave. After that we set some foods and drinks to thank and pray for our ancestors.

After the usual rituals all of the family members gather together and eat what we have prepared for the ritual. Some families would go out to eat but usually restaurants are closed on Chuseok so we would stay inside.

Food is a great deal at Chuseok but it is more of a gathering of all the family members and gets a chance to know what's going on in their lives. It's a very important holiday for everyone to get in touch with others.

How to maintain your F-1 Visa Status:

- 1. Maintain a valid passport, I-20, and I-94.
- 2. Attend Madonna University.
- **3. Pursue a full course of study and make progress towards completion.**
- 4. Apply for extensions of program <u>before</u> the program end date on the I-20
- 5. Follow USCIS procedures for changing from one program to another.
- 6. Limit on-campus employment to 20 hours while school is in session.
- 7. Refrain from off-campus employment without authorization.
- 8. Report a change of address to USCIS within 10 days of the change on Form AR-11
- **Full-time study is defined as 12 credit hours a semester (9 if graduate). Only a maximum of 3 credits of online courses can be counted toward the full-time load.

If you have any questions about your visa status, please stop by the International Students Office: Room 1207 or 1209. The ISO has useful information on maintaining your visa, travel requirements, employment, applying for a social security card, applying for a driver's license, and health insurance requirements.
