

Signature and/or IRS Consent Required on 2025-2026 FAFSA

IRS consent and/or signatures are missing from your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The U.S. Department of Education is required to receive IRS consent and collect signatures from the applicant and all contributors, if applicable, when the FAFSA is filed. A contributor is anyone required to provide information, consent and approval for the transfer of federal tax information, and a signature on the form. The FAFSA cannot be processed until all signatures and approvals are received.

You and/or your contributors must correct the FAFSA by completing the following steps:

- Go to FAFSA® Application | Federal Student Aid at www.fafsa.gov
- Log in using the FSA ID* and Password of the person with the missing information
 *To create a <u>StudentAid.gov account</u>, go to: <u>https://studentaid.gov/apply-for-aid/fafsa/filling-out#creating-an-account</u>
- Click on Dashboard
- Select the FAFSA that indicates Action Required under the My Activity section
- Select Approve and provide IRS consent and approval and/or
- Select Provide Signature and sign and submit the form (By signing the FAFSA, the applicant and contributors are assuming responsibility for the accuracy of the information reported and agreeing to the terms of the certification in the Signature sections of the FAFSA.)
- Repeat the steps above for each person with a missing signature and/or IRS consent and approval
