We seek candidates with strong teaching skills and committed to develop partnerships with other programs across the university as well as with the community.

As the program director of the Modern Languages Program, the candidate will be in charge of overseeing Modern Languages adjunct faculty and developing the curriculum of the Spanish program to ensure that it meets the requirements of the Michigan Department of Education while remaining competitive and up to date. Duties include teaching undergraduate Spanish courses and teacher certification Modern Languages Methodology courses, and overseeing teacher candidates while undertaking their field experiences. Additionally, candidates are expected to design and present their recruitment strategy to continue expanding the Modern Languages program.

Qualifications:

1. Master's degree required, PhD preferred, ABD candidates seriously considered.
2. Native or near-native fluency in Spanish and English.
3. Minimum of two years teaching experience at the college-level.
4. Ability and availability to teach day, evening and online courses.
5. Demonstrated scholarship through presentations, publications or practice.
