Course Highlights

This course, offered by Madonna University's College of Nursing and Health, has been designed for nurses who have been out of clinical practice for longer than two years and are wishing to return to an adult setting in acute care, home care, and/or long term-care.

The RN Refresher Course is intended to assist the nurse in completing agency orientation with confidence. An update on adult medical-surgical conditions commonly encountered in hospital, home care, and long-term care settings will be provided. General concepts of disease management, professional and legal accountability, critical thinking skills, assessment, documentation, pharmacology, delegation, clinical practice guidelines, and discharge planning will be presented.

This 8-day course will be held on Madonna University's main campus in Livonia. Classes will meet 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. on the following dates:
