hope you had a wonderful summer with time for family, friends, and relaxation. It is time to get back to work and move forward toward your goals. I support each of you as you diligently work to make meaningful progress toward your goals. Let me know how I may assist you.

Undergraduate students, it is not too early to think about your next steps. I recommend you take time to talk to family, friends, faculty, and mentors about your plans. I am available to discuss graduate programs offered in the School of Business. The School of Business offers the Master of Business Administration (MBA), Master of Science in Business Leadership (MSBL), Master of Science in Health Services Administration (MSHSA), and Master of Science in Accountancy programs. Reviewing information online about the programs is a great place to start. I hope you create a list of your questions and then schedule a meeting with me to talk about graduate programs.

Graduate students, remember to check the Graduate Advising for School of Business Blackboard group. School of Business graduate students are automatically enrolled in the group. Enrollment is updated on an annual basis. If you do not have access to the group, please send me an email with your student number. The group is used to provide essential information for our graduate students.

If you plan on graduating in December 2022 and have not filed your application for graduation, it is past due, and you must submit it to me immediately. If you plan on graduating in May 2023, you must apply for graduation by the end of September 2022. If you have not applied, you must complete the application at https://ww4.madonna.edu/pdf/Forms/App_For_Graduation_2.pdf, pay the fee, and return the form and receipt to me via email for signature and submission to the Graduate School. The Graduate School will conduct an audit to ensure that you have completed all required courses.

As you know, students in the MBA, MSBL, and MSHSA programs are required to complete a two-part capstone, BR 6210 Quantitative Methods for Business Research during fall term of the last year of the program, and BUS 6950 Graduate Business Capstone during winter term of the last year of the program. Students are encouraged to speak with faculty and identify potential capstone project topics as they progress through their program. The goal is for students to have a project topic identified before beginning BR 6210. Last year's capstone projects were presented at the April 2022 Symposium for Research, Scholarship and Creativity. I was impressed, intrigued, and proud of the work the capstone students shared. I am eager to see the capstone projects at the 2023 Symposium for Research, Scholarship and Creativity. You are encouraged to attend.

Take a moment to review your goals and recommit to actively working to achieve them. Use the resources and opportunities that the School of Business and Madonna University have to offer. I look forward to working with you this year.


