Job Title: Full-time Psychology Faculty Member and Program Director of the Master of Science in Clinical Psychology Program
Department: Department of Behavioral and Social Sciences
Reports To: Dean, College of Education and Human Development

SUMMARY

The Psychology Program at Madonna University in Livonia, Michigan—a program with a strong focus on teaching psychology to undergraduates—is seeking a new full-time faculty member to begin August, 2022. The applicant should have completed an APA-approved doctoral program and be a license-eligible clinical psychologist in Michigan. The position will involve teaching courses mainly at the undergraduate level. The position will also include the opportunity to re-establish and oversee the Master of Science in Clinical Psychology Program. The ideal candidate will have experience teaching courses that have been part of both undergraduate and graduate curriculums. The candidate should also have a background in research design and should demonstrate the ability to provide opportunities for students to participate in the applicant's own research.

The master's program, which graduates students who can obtain a limited license in clinical psychology in the state of Michigan, has been designed with a psychodynamic theoretical orientation. While applicants with a background in other approaches will be considered, the ideal applicant will be comfortable with the psychodynamic approach and open to exploring theoretical integration.

Rank and salary will be commensurate with academic qualifications and experience. Excellent benefits will be provided.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Teaches a variety of undergraduate courses across a range of psychological disciplines.
2. Conducts student recruitment and retention activities for the program.
3. Provides academic advising for students within the program.
4. Oversees undergraduate field placements in the mental health concentration.
5. Participates in curriculum review and renewal.
6. Assists in program assessment and evaluation.
7. Serves on department/college/university committees as assigned.
8. Other duties as assigned.

RESPONSIBILITIES UNIQUE TO THE MASTER OF SCIENCE IN CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY PROGRAM

1. Represents the program to the clinical psychology community and to associated professional organizations.
2. Develops admissions standards and oversees admittance of students into the program in coordination with the graduate school.
3. Works closely with instructors to ensure that the curriculum prepares students for the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP).
4. Oversees the practicum placement process.

5. Keeps current with ethical and licensing issues that are of concern to students and faculty.
6. Ensures that all clinical activities associated with the program are in compliance with Federal and state laws and regulations and meet the ethical principles and standards set forth by the APA.
7. Updates the Student Manual for distribution to students each fall.
8. Participates in the development and grading of comprehensive exams.

SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITIES

Carries out supervisory responsibilities in accordance with the organization's policies and applicable laws. Responsibilities may include interviewing, hiring and training; planning, assigning and directing work; addressing complaints and resolving problems.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Doctoral degree. Minimum of five years university-level full-time teaching experience or equivalence. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively with employees at all levels. Leadership experience in a higher education setting a preferred. Working knowledge of Microsoft Office suite applications and other software used for training and professional development.
