YOUR ROLE

- Provide a complete position description
- Fill out a learning agreement that defines intern responsibilities and project assignments
- Supervise the student intern in a safe and healthy work environment
- Complete a written evaluation of the student's performance and facilitate an on-site visit
- Maintain open communication with Madonna Career Services staff

PAID VS. UNPAID INTERNSHIPS

You determine whether the internship position is paid or unpaid. When arranging unpaid internships, we follow the criteria established by the U.S. Department of Labor.

Criteria for Unpaid Internships

- While internship includes actual operation of the employer's facilities, it is similar to training given in an educational setting;
- Internship experience is for the benefit of the student;
- Intern does not displace regular employees, but works under close supervision of existing staff;
- Employer providing training derives no immediate advantage from the intern's activities; and on occasion may see operations impeded;
- Intern is not necessarily entitled to a job at the conclusion of the internship; and
- Employer and intern understand that the intern is not entitled to wages for the internship.

TYPES OF INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCES

Professional, managerial or technical work experiences related to Madonna academic programs could qualify as internships, with students employed as trainees, assistants or project coordinators. If unpaid, the student must be able to register the internship for course credit. Typically, work assignments increase in complexity and variety as the student gains knowledge and skills. Interns are required to work a minimum of 120 hours over the course of 15 weeks.

YOUR NEXT STEPS

Contact Career Services and provide a position description. An internship coordinator will refer qualified candidates for you to interview. If you decide to employ a Madonna intern, please inform the coordinator, who will organize the internship for you and the student.
