


A Collection of Prayers for the Madonna University Community

Prayers of St. Francis of Assisi

1. Prayer for Peace

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is dispair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, as to console; to be understood, as to understand; to be loved, as to love with all my soul. For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born into eternal life. Amen.

2. Prayer Before a Crucifix

Most high, glorious God, Enlighten the darkness of my heart and give me Lord, a correct faith, a certain hope, a perfect charity, sense and knowledge, so that i may carry out your holy and true command. Amen.

3. Praise to the Most High God

Lord God: you alone are holy, you who work wonders! You are strong, you are great, you are the Most High, you are the almighty King, you, holy Father, King of heaven and earth. Lord God: you are Three and you are One, you are goodness, all goodness, you are the highest Good, Lord God, living and true. You are love and charity, you are wisdom, you are humility, you are patience, you are beauty, you are sweetness, you are safety, you are rest, you are joy, you are our hope and our delight, you are justice, you are moderation vou are all our wealth and riches overflowing. You are beauty, you are gentleness, you are our shelter, our guard and our defender, you are strength, you are refreshment, you are our hope. you are our faith. vou are our love, you are our complete consolation, you are our life everlasting, great and wonderful Lord, all-powerful God, merciful Savior. Amen.

4. Canticle of Creatures

Most High, all-powerful, all-good Lord, All praise is Yours, all glory, all honor and all blessings. To you alone, Most High, do they belong, and no mortal lips are worthy to pronounce Your Name. Praised be You my Lord with all Your creatures, especially Sir Brother Sun, Who is the day through whom You give us light. And he is beautiful and radiant with great splendour, Of You Most High, he bears the likeness. Praised be You, my Lord, through Sister Moon and the stars, In the heavens you have made them bright, precious and fair. Praised be You, my Lord, through Brothers Wind and Air, And fair and stormy, all weather's moods, by which You cherish all that You have made. Praised be You my Lord through Sister Water, So useful, humble, precious and pure. Praised be You my Lord through Brother Fire, through whom You light the night and he is beautiful and playful and robust and strong. Praised be You my Lord through our Sister, Mother Earth who sustains and governs us, producing varied fruits with coloured flowers and herbs. Praise be You my Lord through those who grant pardon for love of You and bear sickness and trial. Blessed are those who endure in peace, By You Most High, they will be crowned. Praised be You, my Lord through Sister Death, from whom no-one living can escape. Woe to those who die in mortal sin! Blessed are they She finds doing Your Will. No second death can do them harm. Praise and bless my Lord and give Him thanks, And serve Him with great humility.

8. Prayer on Entering a Church

We adore You, most holy Lord Jesus Christ, here, and in all Your churches throughout the world, and we bless You, because by Your holy Cross, You have redeemed the world.

9. To Jesus in the Eucharist

Every day He humbles himself, Just as he did when He descended From the royal throne Into the Virgin's womb, Every day coming to us in humble appearance, Every day descending from the Father's bosom Into the hands of the priest over the altar. Just like the holy apostles To whom he revealed himself in true flesh, So He shows himself to us in the form Of consecrated bread. As hey with their own eyes saw his body, And yet with the eyes of faith, Believed that he was God, So we, seeing the bread that it is His most holy Body And Blood, living and true. In this way the Lord is always present Among the faithful. As He said himself, "Behold I am with you For all times even to the end of the world."

Prayers of St. Clare of Assisi

1. I Come, O Lord

I come, O Lord, unto Your sanctuary to see the life and food of my soul. As I hope in You, O Lord, inspire me with that confidence which brings me to Your holy mountain. Permit me, Divine Jesus, to come closer to You, that my whole soul may do homage to the greatness of Your majesty; that my heart, with its tenderest affections, may acknowledge Thine infinite love; that my memory may dwell on the admirable mysteries here renewed every day, and that the sacrifice of my whole being may accompany Thine.

2. Blessing

What you hold may you always hold.
What you do, may you always do and never abandon.
But with swift pace, light step and unswerving feet,
so that even your steps stir up no dust,
Go forward, the spirit of our God has called you.

3. Behold, Hold and Enfold

I behold the Lord
I see His outstretched hands
I see the blood from His wounds.
I see the love in the eyes of Jesus.
I see His gracious acceptance of me.
Jesus has come out of the tomb —
He still has the scars, but now they are glorious, with the glory of heaven.
Still looking at the Lord, I reach out and touch Him.
I hold the Lord — and I am held in His love.

Love enfolds It is no longer I that live, but Christ that lives in me. I am secure in the Lord. I can look out, now, through the Lord's eyes.
I can see the world as He created it, in His mercy,

4. God Chooses Poverty

O sweet Poverty! It was you who our Lord Jesus Christ, Who holds sway over heaven and earth, chose to embrace above everything else.

In fact he said: "Foxes have lairs, the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man

has nowhere to lay his head."

When in fact he Christ rested his head on his breast it was to render his last breath.

If therefore so great a Lord, descending into the womb of the Virgin, Wished to appear to the world as despised, poor and needy, so that men may become rich through him In heavenly goods, then exult and raise up your hearts filled with great happiness and spiritual joy.

5. The Glory of the Heavenly Kingdom

If you suffer with Him you will also reign with Him; if you cry with Him, you will also laugh with Him; If with Him you die upon the cross, you will possess with Him the heavenly dwelling with the splendour of the saints, and your name will be written in the Book of Life and be famous among men.

You will share eternal riches rather than perishable ones, and you will live forever.

Draw to yourself, by humility, the strength of the faith and the arms of poverty, that incomparable treasure, hidden in the field of this world and human hearts, with which you may buy for yourself the One, who from nothing created all things.

6. The Mirror of Eternity

Bring your eyes before the mirror of eternity; bring your soul into the splendour of glory;

Bring your heart before Him who is the image of the divine substance, and transform yourself entirely By means of contemplation into His divine image. Then you too will experience that which is reserved solely for His friends, and you will taste that secret sweetness which God Himself has reserved from the beginning for those who love Him.

Without even giving a second glance at the seductions which, in this restless and fallacious world, Entrap the blind who give their hearts to it, love Him with all of yourself He who for your love gave all of Himself.

7. O Glorious Saint Clare

God has given you the power of working miracles continually, and the favor of answering the prayers of those who invoke your assistance in misfortune, anxiety, and distress; we beseech you, obtain for us from Jesus, through Mary, His Blessed Mother, what we beg of you so fervently and hopefully, if it be for the greater honour and glory of God and for the good of our souls. Amen.

10. Healing

O Blessed Saint Clare, your life shines like a beacon and cast its light down the ages of the Church to guide the way of Christ. Look with compassion on the poor and humble who call on you for help. As you bow before your Eucharistic Lord in Heaven, speak to Him of my afflicted body and my broken spirit. Ask Him to heal me and to wash away my sins in His precious Blood. Great Servant of Christ, remember the needs of my family and all those I pray for. Defend us from everything that would threaten our Holy Catholic faith. Hear the cry of the poor and make it a song of intercession, rising from your poor heart to the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus, our Healer, our Savior, and our Lord. Amen.

St. Felix of Cantalice offered this thank you to all who contributed to the needs of the Friars and the poor, he said this so often that he was known as Brother Deo Gratias.

5.

God, our Father, we thank you for the graces you bestowed on your servant St. Felix of Cantalice during his lifetime. Bless us, as we strive to imitate his service to the poor, his commitment to prayer, his devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and his love for the Eucharist. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

6.

Humility and Charity: In relations with his confrères, St. Felix was a model of humility and charity. He accepted rebukes from others with sincere cheerfulness and gratitude. He was a kind, considerate and agreeable companion. The genuineness of his humility and charity was most evident in his zeal for the spiritual welfare of his fellow friars. Let us pray in imitation of St. Felix that we treat others with consideration and kindness.

7.

Poverty: In love with poverty like his Father St. Francis, St. Felix contented himself with the barest essentials of life. His habit and cloak were so patched that it was difficult to find a piece of his habit's original cloth. His room was furnished with only a board which served as his bed and a small table on which he carved little wooden crosses for distribution to benefactors and friends. Let us pray in imitation of St. Felix that we sincerely strive to live a simple lifestyle.

Joy: Severe though the life of St. Felix may appear, it was filled with genuine happiness which radiated on all within the friary. His austerities were only a means of attaining union with God, and they were made light and sweet by grace obtained from the sacraments and prayer. Everywhere he went, he spread the gospel of joy. Let us pray in imitation of St. Felix that we strive to serve the Lord and each other always with a joyful heart.

9.

Gratitude: The love which burned in St. Felix's heart and the special graces bestowed on him make the story of his forty years in Rome more like that of an apostle than that of a humble lay brother soliciting alms for his community. He preached a silent sermon by his joy and charity. Kind and courteous toward all, he thanked all with a sincere "Deo Gratias" for both good and ill treatment. Let us pray in imitation of St. Felix that we be grateful to God for all the graces bestowed on us.

10.

Compassionate Heart: The compassionate heart of St. Felix had a special predilection for the poor and the sick. With the permission of his superiors, he shared the alms he solicited with the needy. On Sundays and holy days, he would visit the sick and the poor in the hospitals or in their homes, comforting them with kind words and distributing the little wooden crosses he had carved. Let us pray in imitation of St. Felix that we have compassion especially for the elderly, ill, and those who are lonely.

Love of Nature: The son of poor but deeply religious peasants, St. Felix spent his childhood tending sheep and cattle on a farm. Like St. Francis of Assisi, he was reverently in love with all creation. The sun, the moon, the stars, birds and flowers, all quickly evoked a sympathetic response from his sensitive soul.

Let us pray in imitation of St. Felix that we come to appreciate the gifts of nature, and that we do all we can to preserve the environment for future generations. Take time to enjoy God's gifts of nature and say, "Deo Gratias."
